4 July 2010

In today's gospel Jesus appointed seventy two disciples, who were to move out into Samaria, to the places he would visit himself. He was in the process of building a community around him.

The disciples were given a list of instructions the first of which was to ask the Lord to send more labourers to the harvest.

The disciples were to travel in pairs, with no money, bag or sandals. They were not to stop along the way to chat to people they met, but were to walk steadily ahead to their destination.

Once arrived, they were to enter a house and greet the family with the words, "Peace to this house". Their welcome would be accepted or rejected but they were to stay in that house eating with the family whatever was offered. While they were in the village they were to cure the sick and say, "The Kingdom of God is very near to you". They were building a welcoming community.

If their approach to a village were rejected, they were to say, "we wipe the dust of this town from our feet, but remember, the Kingdom of God is near".

Of course, as with us today, there were already communities within the society, such as the Pharisees, the Essenes and the Zealots. The Samaritans made up a community of the excluded. These groups lived a separate life of their own. They maintained an exclusiveness quite contrary to the old values of welcoming newcomers, sharing what they had, gathering together around the table and including those who had been on the outer.

When I looked around last Sunday and saw the many who had gathered to farewell Fr Laurie, I saw a flourishing community of people, who contribute in a multitude of ways towards making it a thriving entity. There is no doubt that being among the many who already share some part of what makes the parish alive is beneficial for everyone.

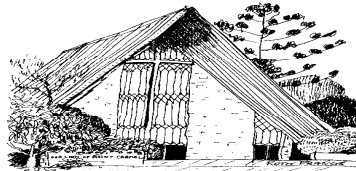
