#### **20th Sunday in Ordinary Time**

14 August 2016



'I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were blazing already!'

What is this we read today? The Prince of Peace speaking to his disciples of fire that will bring division to the very heart of human Society!

As Jesus continues his mission, there is an anguish at this point. He speaks of divine love as driving his mission and his central message of Good News to the

Poor. He knows, however, that he must confront, through death and resurrection, the hostility to divine love lurking in the heart of humankind. The terrible tension between the love of God as Jesus knows it to be and the fragility and reality of the world to which he, as love incarnate, is reaching out.

During his ministry Jesus spoke of the poor, the accumulation of wealth, care of those in need, generosity, justice, forgiveness and mercy. Our faith is not merely a private devotion but is a public living out of the values of God's reign. This then, is where Jeremiah's cry for peace in the first reading is, seemingly, in conflict with Jesus' blazing fire which can purge old growth that hinders new messages and new ways of thinking.

However, these rather harsh sounding words can also be comforting because they recognize conflict as a necessary part of Christian life. Jesus indicates that conflict between what is and what should be, is part of our commitment to God's reign and commitment to bringing Good News to the world.

For us then, this day, here at Mt Carmel, what is the fire that purifies? Looking seriously at the Gospel values may lead to facing some hard choices, for example, about lifestyle and personal comfort in order to do with less so that others might be simply able to live. Such questions, like the fire that Jesus came to bring, purifies, as does metal in the hands of a skilled person, until we 'ring true'.
