32nd Sunday in **Ordinary Time** (Year A)

'Knowledge is knowing that a tomato is a fruit; wisdom is not putting it in a fruit salad', said writer Miles Kington. Today's readings are all about wisdom and about more important things than fruit salads.

Today we have more knowledge than ever. The internet provides masses of instant information - just Google it and check it out on Wikipedia. We are told we should make our decisions based on quality information. In our personal and work lives we are under constant pressure to make numerous, speedy decisions.

But information alone is not sufficient for good decision making. First, I need to be clear what is most important to me. What sits at the foundation of my life? The aim of our lives as Christians is to grow to be more like Jesus and ultimately to live in the love of God forever. Today's second reading from St Paul promises us that, if this is our aim, we will 'stay forever with the Lord'. If this is our goal, then it shapes all our decisions.

Second, making wise decisions requires a reflective approach to life. Our ready access to information can lead us to believe somewhat arrogantly that we are totally in control of our lives. The volume and amount of information can rush us into thinking we must make quick decisions.

The Christian tradition of discernment advises us to take our time with the important decisions of life. Silence, prayer, reading of scripture, gathering appropriate information and taking wise counsel from those we respect are all elements of good decision making. Life is complex and at times messy. Finding our own 'truth' in the midst of all that means opening ourselves to the Holy Spirit and that requires a certain discipline.

Such an approach will lead us to become wiser people more attuned to the mind of Christ. A reflective attitude to life will gradually filter through all our decisions, both big and small. Then we won't be like the unwise women in today's gospel who were not ready when the Lord came - and maybe then we won't put 'tomatoes' in the fruit salads of our lives!
