October  $\mathbf{1}^{\mathrm{st}}$  in our Carmelite calendar is the Feast of Saint Therese of Lisieux.

A beggar had been sitting by the side of a road for over thirty years. One day a stranger walked by: "Spare some change? "mumbled the beggar, mechanically holding out his old baseball cap. "I have nothing to give you "said the stranger. Then he asked: "What's that you are sitting on?" "Nothing" replied the beggar. "Just an old box. I have been sitting on for as long as I can remember". "Ever looked inside? "asked the stranger. "No said the beggar. What's the point? There's nothing in there". "Have a look inside," insisted the stranger. The beggar managed to pry open the lid. With astonishment, disbelief and elation, he saw that the box was filled with gold.

We all can remain in some ways like the beggar sitting on his box when we have not ventured on the journey inside, into our inner selves, to discover our true wealth. The truth that Therese discovered and shares with us is that our truest value lies in us being in the very Heart of God.

How often do we look outside of ourselves, beyond this inner wealth, this Mystery we call God, for validation, security of person and love itself?

"It is in TRUST and TRUST alone that we are led into Love".....our sister Therese tells us....she continues...."we can never have too much Confidence in our God."

She made it simple. "Love alone is what counts" and for her the Gospels were sufficient!

In December last year I wrote about the Coorparoo school and parish community concentrating their fundraising efforts on raising funds for the build of the new toilet and kitchen block for the boarding house in Zumalai.

We have reported before that there are 27 boys in residence at the boarding house. All these boys come from outlying villages and would not be able to attend school without having a place where they can board. Education has been a priority for The Carmelites for some years now and it is wonderful when we can report on the change it makes not only to the life of the individual who receives the education but also to their family, and community. The gift of education truly is a way of changing the future and escaping poverty.

#### Over 2015, 2016 and 2017 the Coorparoo community raised a total of \$39,143 for this project as follows:

Friends of Zumalai – Parish fundraising group – \$16,163

Mount Carmel Primary School -\$13,000

Parents and Friends Association - Mount Carmel Primary School Coorparoo - \$10,000

The cost to build the new bathroom block and kitchen is \$44,550. The Coorparoo community have almost covered the entire cost of this project. What a fantastic effort!

In late July Br Antonio from Zumalai commenced the building of the bathroom block, and the kitchen will follow once this is complete. These two photos show the progress to date.

Thank you to the Coorparoo community for helping to bring this project to life. The support we receive from our schools, parish and community groups cannot be underestimated.
