Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

'You do not know what you are asking.' Today's Gospel reminds us that to be a leader, you need to serve. We might wish or ask to lead, without fully considering the commitment and investment necessary to have that position authentically ours. We see successful and/or influential people and want to be like them, and have that success or influence.

True leadership comes with service and hard work. If we take a close look at what motivates us in our ambitions, it is hoped that the answer is to serve in order to make our world a better place for all.

Jesus' ministry was lived with a grand purpose and objective; to establish God's kingdom. Jesus was aware that James and John were ignorant of the nature of the kingdom he was setting up. His kingdom was to be universal and inclusive of all. His kingdom was to be spiritual and not political. It was not like any earthly kingdom. Jesus knew that to set up this kingdom he needed to suffer and sacrifice his life. It is through this that his kingdom was established. High price indeed.

Part of our receiving the Eucharist is to commit to working towards challenging the wrong, hurtful and discriminatory in our world. A lot of the pain in our world comes about because of violations of the Gospel values. Challenging these violations is not always easy. Generally, people do not want to be reprimanded for ill-considered and selfish actions. The ransom Jesus paid brought about his kingdom. What ransom would we pay? Jesus served us with unconditional love. Do we, can we, love the same? Love must be the motivation for all our actions and words. Unconditional love is service in action, which is the heart of leadership.
