October 1st happens to be the feast of
Saint Theresese of Lisieux
one of the great women of the 19th century.

Theresese began her journey as a Carmelite at the tender age of 15 entering the enclosed convent in the small town of Lisieux in France, where her family home was, on the 9th April 1888.

She was to die a short time later at the age of 24 on the 30th September 1897.

Even though her life was spent in an enclosed convent as a nun, she had an overwhelming desire to be a missionary. It was for her an aspiration for helping all

humanity and to give concrete expression to love of God for all her sisters and brothers without judgement.

We know and have heard many times to be a Christian IS to be a missionary, it is the consequence of our baptism, in other words to live not for ourselves but for others.

“ The Church is missionary by nature.” We hear in the documents of the Second Vatican Council which took place 50 years ago!

Every human person has the right to know Jesus and to know of his Good News and every baptised person has the responsibility to proclaim it. This is a consequence of being baptised into the faith community.

Theresese understood this long before any Church documents spoke about it. Her realisation was that the saving power of Jesus embraced the whole of humanity, especially the poor and her desire was to be the one who embraced the whole of humanity with love.

“ My Vocation is to be Love in the world” was the ultimate realisation she was to come to.

St. Theresese, in her “ little way’ indicates an acknowledgement of her poverty in the face of her appreciation that God’s embrace would always be sufficient. Theresese was well aware of her own poverty within her own humanity, in her mental suffering as a young child and her physical suffering as a young adult. She was to discover that her greatest treasure was her own experience of her vulnerability not as obstacle but more as a stepping stone to the realisation of God’s Flame of love burning within her.

God was to be found waiting to be known in weakness.

It is not what we do for God that is so important, but rather what God has done for us! When we move from trying to prove ourselves worthy of God’s love and just allow God to love us and grow in an ever deepening awareness of God loving us, it is at that point we really do begin to fall in love with God, who has already fallen in love with us, AS WE ARE!

If I believe that we are ALL created in the image and likeness of God then WE know like Theresese that God does not make junk!

“ Who am I to judge?” words that have become famous by Pope Francis uttering them, and when we live this truth we too can say ‘we have done no more than our duty!’

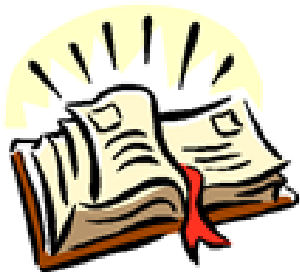
