"In your heart you know that it is not the same to live without him; what you have come to realize; what has helped you to live and given you hope is what you also need to communicate to others. Our falling short of perfection should be no excuse; on the contrary, mission is a constant stimulus not to remain mired in mediocrity but to continue growing." Pope Francis

Today we see the prophet confronted with a sense of the presence and holiness of God in the sanctuary of the Temple and thus becomes aware of his own sinfulness and inadequacy. He knows God and he knows himself. It is a moment of painful and deep conversion: 'I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips.' Precisely at the moment of this realisation he receives healing as an angel purifies his lips with a live coal taken from the altar. There follows his own prophetic mission: 'Whom shall I send?'... 'Here I am, send me.'

When the apostles embarked on their mission to become "fishers of people" they didn't go unprepared. They spent years learning from Jesus Christ and they were ultimately moved and guided by the Holy Spirit. Yet, their journey started somewhere; it started with simple fisher folk who probably knew a lot more about knots than they knew about theology. It is when Peter is confronted with the presence of God in Jesus, when he owns his own sinfulness and unworthiness to be associated with him ('Leave me, Lord, ...'), that the call comes to him: 'Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people.'

Only those who have plumbed the depths of their own sinfulness and unworthiness, who have come to 'know' both God and themselves in this way, are apt to be servants of the healing and life-giving word. No matter where we are in life, we can drop our nets and follow Jesus. We are not called to abandon the position that we have in the world but rather are called to make our world holy where we are.

Jesus calls us all to evangelize: how is He calling me?

St Josephine Bakhita is the patron saint of victims of slavery and of Sudan. Australians are being urged to work together, through grass roots action and corporate governance, to end slavery around the world.

Australian Catholic Religious Against Trafficking in Humans (ACRATH), Catholic Religious Australia (CRA) and Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (ACBC) are inviting Catholics to mark St Bakhita Day on February 8 2019, and at weekend Masses on February 9 and 10.


