Finding The Way Through The Desert

What image comes to mind when you think of the desert? What are your feelings about this image? Is the desert a place for survival, struggle, solitude or salvation? Do we see the desert, or the idea of a desert as a place that is devoid of life, a place abandoned or do we see it as life itself stripped down to its very core? A place to find solace, a place to think, to spend time alone and to face truths devoid of distractions.

In today's Gospel, for the first Sunday of Lent, we find Jesus spending time alone in the desert. Jesus however rebuffs each temptation He receives with scripture, even when the Devil tries to trap him by using a verse from scripture itself.

And yet the desert can be a place of fruitfulness. Moses reminds his people in the first reading that God has led them out of slavery and to give thanks to God for his providence. In the second reading Paul restates this core belief of the new Christians that it is through Faith that we are saved.

Right now the Catholic Church in Australia and indeed the western world is going through a deep spiritual crisis, exacerbated by two current high profile cases of historical sexual abuse. Archbishop McCarrick of Washington has recently been defrocked and laicized and our own Cardinal George Pell has been convicted of historical sexual abuse although the appeals process for that needs to run its course.

Many Catholics feel a deep sense of shame and sorrow about what is happening to our Church and feel a deep sense of loss and grief for the Church we love and want to belong to. Many will go through the stages of grief and loss described so well by Dr Elizabeth Kubler-Ross; that is of denial, anger, bargaining, depression and acceptance and not necessarily in that linear order.

This crisis however, coming as it is just before Lent, gives us an opportunity to take stock of not only where our Church is and needs to go to but also more importantly ourselves, for we are the Church, the Body of Christ.

So I invite you to take that journey into the desert and see it not as a place of abandonment and exile but rather as a place of solitude and reflection. A time to get back to your core beliefs and a time to find your unique faith connection with God.

Do as Jesus did by focusing on the Word of God to rebuff temptations and you too will find the way through the desert. God bless you on this journey.

ROOF RESTORATION PROJECT

The safety of our community has been paramount to the Finance Council's decision to approve the replacement of our Church roof tiles with Colourbond sheeting.

The Plant and Resources Committee discovered that the previous roof tiles were unsafely positioned on the Church roof, and there was a serious possibility of major damage occurring to either the building or more importantly to people.

The removal of them revealed how serious the situation was and it required immediate action, for the protection of the safety of our children and families

The cost of the restoration of our Church Roof, including for skylight repairs (which incidentally still needs to be done) was \$370,000.

We have been able to pay a certain amount from our Parish Investment Account, which has left the remaining \$123,00 still outstanding.

The Current Loan amounts to \$123,000, which we are required to repay to the Archdiocese. The outstanding loan will increase to a range between \$180-185,000 when the skylight repairs are complete.

I am appealing to ALL PARISHONERS to contribute in whatever way you can to the repayment of this outstanding Loan.

Some people have already given generously to this appeal.



From the Parish Safeguarding Committee

The Parish Safeguarding Committee has been continuing its work in developing an Implementation Plan to ensure that our parish complies with the requirements of Government, The Archdiocese and the Carmelite Province for all in the parish. Key parts of that strategy have already been implemented in those ministries with a high exposure to children and vulnerable adults, namely Children's Liturgy of the Word and Communion to those in homes and aged care facilities.

The Archdiocese has mandated requirements for each ministry in the parish. We are now moving to the next phase of implementation and many of you who are involved in ministry will be contacted in the near future by your Ministry Coordinator to advise of the requirements for your ministry.

For some, this will involve applying for a Blue Card (Working with Children check or equivalent), having a Police Check, attending Safeguarding Training or other requirements. Others will have fewer requirements. If you are in more than one ministry, the requirements may differ from one to the other. In that case you will need to meet the more extensive requirements.

We realise that these procedures may seem daunting. Through the Parish Office and the Safeguarding Committee, we will be offering support to ministers who need assistance in completing the various forms and training.

We very much appreciate the ministry of so many in the parish and we urge you to bear with us as we implement these mandatory processes. Thank you for your contribution to the mission of our parish and to ensuring the safety of children and vulnerable adults in our care.

Good news: Late in 2018 the Federal Government passed the Modern Slavery Act, which will ask big companies to report on their efforts to introduce slavery-free goods and services.
