(Year C)

Mary Magdalene and the other Marys in this Easter Gospel went on a search for the Lord. Through events that seemed like earthquakes, they found an empty tomb - a pointer to the meaning, direction and new life they were seeking. And in this they met Jesus who calmed their fears, called them by name and sent them to join and to announce to us where we gather 'Christ is Risen, just as he promised.'
