It seems serendipitous after the great celebration of our feast day last weekend that today's Gospel is about prayer, one of the three elements clustered around contemplation at the heart of our identity as a Carmelite parish. In the school hall last Sunday, students had visually interpreted these elements - prayer, community and service and it was against this backdrop that we came together in prayer and celebration. The brochure prepared for the feast day (and available at the back of the church) talks of the solitude of prayer in which we experience the compassion of God, enabling us to live in solidarity, empowering us to minister to those in need, and enabling us to be patient and forgiving towards each other. It's a powerful thing!

Such an understanding of prayer is reflected in Luke's recount of Jesus' response to the disciple who asked him how to pray. Throughout the Gospel, God is referred to as Father, indicating that prayer **must be** relational. Theologian Richard Rohr describes prayer as *primal or naked speech*, talking with total honesty, without fear or preoccupation with what others might think. Prayer requires trust, trust that your prayer will be heard, received and respected. And we are assured of all these things through the lesson Jesus teaches.

Scripture scholars have commented that prayer is not a series of requests but our recognition of God's holiness. The way Luke describes Jesus' response invites us to reflect on the words we learned at a young age and repeat often. Father, hallowed is your name.

Many questions which emerged during the nationwide listening and dialogue encounters in preparation for the 2020 Plenary Council focussed on prayer, and particularly the place of prayer in our fast paced world. It seems that the disciples' question two thousand years ago still has great relevance for us today.

Prayer is a dynamic process, a lifting up of heart and mind to God. Prayer holds promise, is a reality, a practice and Richard Rohr would argue, a state of being.

Lord, teach us how to pray.

Themes for Discernment and the
commencement of the Listening and
Discernment phase of the Plenary journey, the
Archdiocese of Brisbane will be hosting a
Brisbane Assembly taking place October 4-5,
2019 at the Edmund Rice Performing Arts
Centre (St Laurence's College) in South
Brisbane.

The Brisbane Assembly aims to provide participants with a deeper understanding of the themes for national discernment, the latest developments and vision casting from the Plenary Council national facilitation team, and most importantly an opportunity to take part in a process of communal discernment led by experienced facilitators.

Participants will also hear from an array of quality presenters on 'Discernment' and 'Effective Communication' to assist with the Listening and Discernment phase. This will aid in empowering participants to engage their own communities with the second phase of the Plenary journey in the lead up to Easter 2020.
