Thirty-First Sunday in **Ordinary Time** (Year B)

The great prayer of Israel, 'The Shema', is the prayer said every morning and evening by the religious Jew and is the prayer on the lips of the dying. These words sum up Israel's moral code love God with all your heart and all your strength and all your mind. The command is found in today's reading from Deuteronomy.

In the gospel Jesus is asked to identify one commandment, and he offers two. The command of the Shema and the second a citation from the Book of Leviticus: 'You shall not hate in your heart anyone of your kin... You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against any of your people, but you shall love your neighbour as yourself.'

By bringing these admonitions together as he does. Jesus shows that, though not identical, they are interrelated, they are the cornerstones of the Christian law. Cornerstones which challenge us to know that the love of God no way detracts from a passionate and effective commitment to one's neighbour.

Love today is often reduced to roses and chocolates, 'meaningful' cards and sentimental posts on Facebook. However, there is nothing sentimental in today's Gospel teaching – God is to be loved for Godself alone and the command to love one's neighbour is built on the preceding verses of Leviticus known to Jesus' listeners in which the Jewish people were instructed not to strip vineyards and orchards bare, but to leave something for the poor and not to steal or exploit labourers.

Therefore, to love your neighbour is a command that is quite radical, an act of imagination where

I ask myself what I actually want from another person - understanding, tolerance, respect, loyalty and compassion - in order to give to the other in the way in which Jesus points to the system of social justice which looked after the poor and which did not exploit workers.

In today's gospel we hear Jesus bringing these two decrees from his Jewish tradition and fusing them into the one command: 'There is no command greater than these.'
